

Time With God



Time With God will help you get organized to read through the entire Bible in an organized and disciplined way. In just one year you will read the complete Word of God by simply reading a portion each day.

Time With God is designed especially for individual and family use. It provides a schedule for personal, daily Bible reading. *Time With God* also provides space to write a brief description of how each portion of Scripture speaks to you each day. Family members can bring their notebooks together for family worship and share insights they received in their personal quiet time. This is an excellent tool for accountability that permits the family to study through the same passages at the same time. Bible Study Groups, Youth Groups, and local churches can also use this workbook in unison.

This method of daily devotions incorporates the 3 R's of Bible study: Read, Reflect, and Record. One reason some people come away cold from Bible reading is because they don't warm by the fires of meditation. Recording your thoughts forces you to reflect and think about what you have just read.

George Mueller, who had thousands of answers to prayer, read through the Bible twice every year. He became intimately acquainted with the God he loved through the time he spent in His Word. The Old Testament reveals the *character of God*. In Psalms we see the *heart of God*. From Proverbs we glean *wisdom from God*. And the New Testament gives us an *understanding of Christ and the Christian life*.

Our family has used *Time With God* along with the One Year Bible that is designed to allow you to read the entire Bible in just 365 days. If you prefer, you can simply follow the daily reading schedule contained in this workbook.

How to Use Time With God

Personal Use

Start your day by asking God to minister to your heart as you read His Word. Get your Bible and *Time With God* workbook and find a quiet place. Read each section: Old Testament, New Testament, Psalms, and Proverbs. Mark the verse/verses that speak to your soul. Meditate on the verses that you have marked. Record the location of these verse/verses in your *Time With God* workbook and briefly describe how they ministered to your heart.

Family Use

Each family member should have his/her own *Time With God* workbook and Bible. Early in the morning is the best time for individual reading and prayer. Children should be instructed and expected to develop the habit of meeting with God each day. I believe that a child is ready for personal devotions as soon as he/she can read. If the child cannot read, a parent can read the Proverbs, Psalms, and New Testament out loud to the child. A younger child who can read and write may begin reading and working through the Proverbs and Psalms sections. As you sense your child is ready, you can assign the New and Old Testament as well.

Select the best time for your family worship: evening, dinner table, etc. Family members should bring their *Time With God* and Bible to family worship. The head of the household should direct this time by having each family member

share the marked verses and insights received. This often provides a platform for further discussion and teaching. It is best to work through each section (Old Testament, Psalms, Proverbs, New Testament) individually with each family member so everyone's attention is directed to the same place in his or her Bible. Depending on the time available and family size, it may be wise to call on different people to relate from only one section rather than have everyone share from all four sections. Be sensitive to the Holy Spirit and concentrate on the areas that are most relevant to your family's needs at the given time.



Challenge to Parents

It is abundantly clear that God expects the heads of households to instruct their families in the things of God. It has always been God's plan that fathers be the primary communicators of truth to their own children. God charged the men of Israel with these words: "And these words, which I command thee this day, shall be in thine heart: And thou shalt teach them diligently unto thy children, and shalt talk of them when thou sittest in thine house, and when thou walkest by the way, and when thou liest down, and when thou risest up" (Deuteronomy 6:6-7). If the parent is going to teach God's words, then the parent must first have those words hidden in his heart. The teaching described here is home-centered, intentional, and casual.

In God's educational program the home is the classroom, the children are the students, the parents are the teachers, and the curriculum is the Bible.

Not only must parents teach their children, they must also teach their children how to teach themselves. *Time With God* can help you accomplish your God-given responsibilities by laying out a systematic approach with built-in, daily accountability. Your children can develop spiritual disciplines that will go with them throughout their entire lives by habitually meeting God early each day. As in every other area of life, the key to success is having a plan and working that plan.

One of the primary goals of Christ Life Ministries is developing Godly families. This is a tool to assist you as you seek to teach, direct, and preserve a Godly seed.
