



AS YOU PREPARE FOR A SPIRITUAL LIFE CRUSADE

The enclosed materials are specifically designed for you as you lead in the spiritual preparation for the upcoming Spiritual Life Crusade. These materials will assist you in delegating the details of the crusade to your people so that nothing will be lacking when the time arrives for the meetings. As pastor, you must be physically, emotionally, and spiritually prepared for whatever God wants to do in your midst! I think of the apostles' words, "It is not reason that we should leave the Word of God, and serve tables. Wherefore, brethren, look ye out among you seven men of honest report, full of the Holy Ghost and wisdom, whom we may appoint over this business. But we will give ourselves continually to prayer, and to the ministry of the word" (Acts 6:2-4).

Prayerfully consider postponing as many regular church activities as you feel feasible during the crusade. Your people must sense your priorities and understand your commitment to the crusade. The video, "How to Have a Real Revival Prayer Meeting" is included on the Prayer Preparation DVD disc in this packet.

We have found it best for the weeknight meetings to begin at 7:00 p.m. if possible. Plan to have a pre-service prayer time one half hour preceding all regular services except Sunday morning. Many times people will want to stay after the services for a time of prayer and sharing. When you feel an after session is appropriate, feel free to issue an invitation to the congregation.

Carefully read all the materials enclosed. Unless otherwise stated, we assume the policies and guidelines are acceptable.

We look forward to working closely with you during the crusade. Feel free to contact me directly with any questions you may have.

PRAYER PREPARATION

PURPOSE: To enlist every member of the church to pray earnestly for the crusade.

This is by far the most important aspect of Crusade preparation. "Prayer is a sure evidence of the presence of God as the rising of the thermometer is evidence of an increase in temperature. If God is near a church, it must pray. If He is not there, one of the first signs of His absence will be lethargy in prayer," said Charles Spurgeon.



Organize prayer groups for men, women and young people. Have meetings at various times and places as your situation dictates.

All prayer should be believing. Jesus said, "If thou canst believe, all things are possible to him that believeth" (Mark 9:23).



You cannot lead others to pray unless you pray. Ask God to give you the "Spirit of prayer."

The next several pages include helpful information as you help the church prepare in prayer for the crusade. Please feel free to copy any or all for distribution.

Suggested “Prayer Countdown” For A Spiritual Life Crusade

The following schedule is given to assist you in praying for spiritual renewal in your life and church. Use it as a guide **beginning four weeks prior to the crusade**. Each week will take on a different aspect of praying for revival.

Four Weeks in Advance - Church Prayer Times

Your church, as a whole body, should be ready to gather and seek God for an outpouring of His Spirit. These should be times of brokenness, repentance, and seeking God to do for us what we cannot do for ourselves. The Pastor and staff should lead in these times of worship and prayer as you seek the Lord for revival. You may want to post a calendar on the office door where people can sign up for a specific time of prayer with you for specific needs. Here are some helpful suggestions to get the church praying:

1. Personal Needs: Pass out 3x5 cards for everyone in the congregation and have them write: **“What do you want God to do for you personally during the coming Crusade?”** Have them write their answers on the card and collect them. No names should be written on the cards. These cards will help your people pinpoint exactly what they expect from God. They will also inform the pastoral staff using them how to pray for members of the congregation.
2. Distribute books on prayer and revival among your people to create interest and desire. C.L.M. has many such books available for purchase [Calvary Road, Power Through Prayer, etc.].
3. During this month of prayer preparation, we suggest that you begin fasting on a regular basis. Begin by fasting one meal at a set time, and replacing that time with Scripture reading and prayer. True revival is often preceded by fasting as well as prayer (Joel 2:12-14). If you begin with one meal, you will soon discover the ability to spend whole days fasting, with special prayer times as well. (See enclosed sheet on Fasting).

I want to encourage you to set your heart to this matter of prayer preparation for revival. **The crusade should be the climax of a month spent seeking God’s face—not an isolated event.** Your threefold enemies: the world, the flesh, and the devil, will give you great conflict. But remember, “the battle is the Lord’s.”

Three Weeks Prior - Group Prayer Meetings

At this time, your people should begin praying with larger groups in the local church. “Cottage” or household prayer meetings should be held at this time. Adjust your church schedule to accommodate times when these meetings can be conducted.

During group prayer, there may be some sharing, but the main emphasis must be on prayer and meeting God. Duplicate and distribute the handout, *“Heart Searching for Prayer, Preparation, and Personal Revival.”* Some churches take an entire service and go through portions or the entire pamphlet during a service. If this approach is taken, time should be provided for the people to pray through the items listed. It is not just to be read—it is to be acted upon by responding in prayer. Another possibility is to have the ushers distribute them to the entire congregation on a Sunday morning. The possibilities are unlimited. Use whatever method you deem most beneficial, but do not fail to pray!

Here is a suggested format for “Cottage” or group prayer meetings:

1. Greeting time
2. Call meeting to order promptly on time
3. One or two songs or choruses
4. Scripture reading (brief comment if necessary)
5. Sharing and requests (Consider having people “pray” their requests rather than sharing them.)
6. Prayer time (Can be done in groups, fours, etc. Don’t be afraid to diversify to keep interest level high.)

Tips for Leading Prayer Groups:

1. Form a circle and start out on your knees.
2. Keep prayer short and to the point (this helps others continue in agreement).
3. Do not sermonize! Prayer is talking to God, not preaching to those around you!
4. Continue to ask God to work in our lives.

Two Weeks in Advance - Prayer with Partners

“Again I say unto you, that if two of you shall agree on earth as touching any thing that they shall ask, it shall be done for them of my Father which is in heaven. For where two or three are gathered together in my name, there am I in the midst of them” (Matthew 18:19,20).

Entering into your third “Countdown week”, you should now begin praying with another believer. Many Bible verses and historical records bear witness to the power and blessing of agreeing with others in prayer. During set times, you should meet for prayer. These times should include the following:

1. Confession of faults and praying for one another (James 5:16).
2. Bearing one another’s burdens, thus fulfilling the law of Christ (Gal. 6:2).
3. Encouraging and building one another in the faith (Heb. 10:25; Heb. 3:13).
4. Sharing testimony of what God is doing in your lives (Psa. 111:1,2).
5. Reading and memorizing Scripture relating to revival and prayer (Ps. 85:6,7; Hab. 3:1,2; Ps. 51; Ps. 79; Hos. 10:12, etc.)

This ministry of praying with one or more other people is very important and should begin immediately upon the third week of preparation. Praying with a partner serves to meet the need for accountability and encouragement.

One Week Before SLC - Personal Revival

1. “How To Have a Real Revival Prayer Meeting” During the week before the Spiritual Life Crusade, the greatest emphasis should be on searching your own heart and asking God to do a new work in your life. Someone has rightly stated “Revival is God’s finger pointed right at me.” The DVD on “How To Have a Real Revival Prayer Meeting” is a professionally done presentation that is designed to be shown to groups that have met together for prayer. It can be shown on a Wednesday night, men’s meeting, youth group, ladies’ group, or a cottage prayer meeting. It provides an easy to follow format of Confession, Thanksgiving, and Requests. It is designed to be followed by an active time of prayer together—not merely viewed and forgotten. You are encouraged to make full use of this as you prepare yourselves in prayer. The presentation is approximately 29 minutes in length.
2. Challenge your people to fast from television and computer viewing this week.
3. Prayer Marathon: You may wish to have an 18 or 24-hour Prayer Marathon by having people sign up for 30 minute segments. This could begin on Friday night and go through Saturday night. Do what your church can and will do, but **PRAY!!**

During this time, be faithful in allowing God to speak to you. Do not neglect this personal time because the whole crusade hinges on your faithfulness in this matter.

FASTING AND PRAYER

Here is a brief outline on leading your church in fasting and prayer in preparation for the upcoming Spiritual Life Crusade. This biblical practice of fasting has been a means of blessing to God's people from Old Testament times to present day.

One pastor implemented 21 days of fasting and prayer before the crusade. People signed up for the day[s] they desired. The blessing was so great that the pastor announced forty more days of fasting and prayer at the close of the meeting!

1. PREACH IT!

The Bible is full of examples when it comes to fasting. Study these passages: Isa. 58: 3-8; Mat. 6:16-18. Jesus expected all His followers would fast because He said "When ye fast", not "If ye fast."

The book "God's Chosen Fast" by Arthur Wallis is published by Christian Literature Crusade. This is a valuable tool which will help you prepare personally, mentally, and practically.

2. PLAN IT!

After educating your people you must lay out a workable plan for your congregation. Maybe it will be one day every week for a month or two. Another possibility is a specific period (example--14 days, 21 days, 40 days) in which people volunteer for days with the goal of having someone on the watchtower at all times. Extended fasts may be appropriate where people are fasting regularly. Seek God's mind and move as you are convinced you are moving according to God's will.

3. PROMOTE IT!

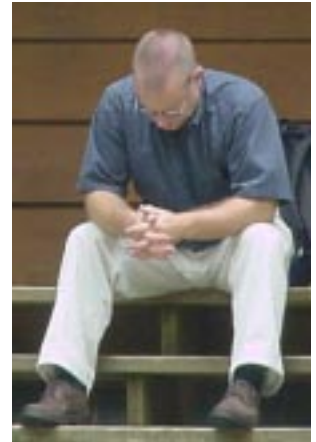
People must understand the principles and the plan before implementation. Queen Esther called the Jews to a 3 day fast. Announce your intentions and encourage people to participate. Be discreet if sign-up is necessary. Fasting is to the Lord and before the Lord. The only reason for signing up would be to insure all days are covered or to secure a general number of those participating. Names should be kept private.

Sheep follow the shepherd and your enthusiasm will be contagious.

4. PRACTICE IT!

The next step is DO IT! Implement your plan. Trust God for great victories. It may be appropriate to have suitable public testimonies to exhort and encourage others.

Watch God bless and seek God's face for a suitable plan of continuation. Your personal participation in this discipline is absolutely vital. You cannot lead your people farther than where you are yourself.



"I HUMBLLED MY SOUL WITH FASTING"

Psalm 35:13

We are living in a day when our nation has turned from God's standard of morality and Biblical holiness. As Christians, our response must be brokenness and humility. David knew this to be the proper heart attitude as he said when compassed about by the wicked, "I humbled my soul with fasting" **Ps 35:13**. God confirms this in **Isaiah 57:15** which says, "I dwell in the high and holy place, with him also that is of a contrite and humble spirit, to revive the spirit of the humble, and to revive the heart of the contrite ones."

Consider the example of Nehemiah when he heard the report concerning the condition of Jerusalem. "And they said unto me, The remnant that are left of the captivity there in the province are in great affliction and reproach: the wall of Jerusalem also is broken down, and the gates thereof are burned with fire. And it came to pass, when I heard these words, that I sat down and wept, and mourned certain days, and fasted, and prayed before the God of heaven" **Neh 1:3,4**. Note that he wept, and mourned **certain days** and fasted and prayed. Again King David has a similar experience when he says "I wept, and chastened my soul with fasting" **Ps 69:10**.

We must realize that nothing of lasting and eternal value will happen at a revival meeting unless God, by his grace and mercy, comes down in mighty Holy Spirit power to build back the broken down walls in the lives of His people and His churches. Jesus said, "**Without me ye can do nothing**" **John 15:5**. In light of this text, the condition of our nation, and the declining spiritual temperature of churches and their members; would you prayerfully consider spending some time in fasting and prayer prior to the revival meeting? Here are a few suggestions on how to implement prayer and fasting for yourself and also some ideas to encourage others:

On an individual basis:

1. Fast and pray at least one day a week for the four weeks prior to the revival meeting - or fast and pray one day a week for the seven weeks prior to the meeting.
2. For those physically able, consider an extended fast of two, three or possibly up to seven days as the Lord leads.

On a group basis as a church:

1. Have a ***21 Day Prayer Countdown to the Revival Meeting*** sign up sheet. Enlist volunteers among the congregation to fast on each of the 21 days preceding the Advance. If the group is too small, enlist other members of the church to participate or shorten the number of days in the countdown.
2. Encourage spouses to fast and pray together.
3. Continue to have seasons of fasting and prayer after the Crusade throughout the year.

As we prepare for the Crusade may our hearts be humbled before God. Let us seek God for revival in the lives of those not just in your church, but also in our whole nation. Whatever you can do in this vital and often neglected discipline of fasting and prayer would be appreciated. Remember, it was said of the woman who broke the alabaster box of precious ointment and poured it on Jesus' head, "She hath done what she could" **Mark 14:8**. For the sake of our own hearts, our families, our churches, and our Lord, let us do what we can!

ACCOMMODATIONS

PURPOSE: To provide adequately for the accommodations of all the team members.

Lodging:

The Vaughan Family: When distance permits, my family and I come together and stay in our travel trailer. All that is needed is a water hookup and electricity. We strongly prefer a 50 amp R.V. hookup. The 50 amp plug needs to be within 40 feet of where the trailer will be parked. The electric breaker, appropriate wire, and R.V. plug can be obtained at an electrical store and should be installed by an electrician who understands R.V. electrical needs.



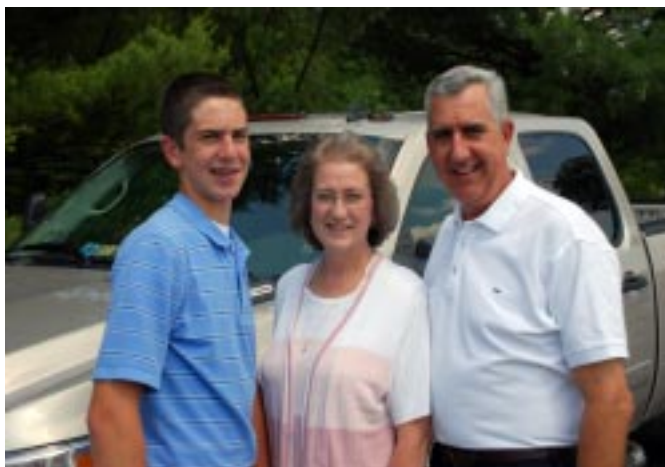
When I fly in, I need to stay in a "newer" motel. Since I have allergies, the room must be clean and free of dust and smoke. I have found that Marriott brand hotels normally have the best air quality for my sinus condition. Please, let me know in advance if motel accommodations are not possible.

Meals:

*Please see page 13 and "Noon Prayer Time and Meal."

Transportation:

If I drive, I will not need another vehicle. If I fly to the field, I will need transportation upon arriving and departing, as well as transportation to all meetings. Often a car is put at my disposal, so I am not totally dependent upon someone else.



ESSENTIAL ITEMS NEEDED

1. Two Long Tables: available for books, audio resources, and free materials (foyer).
2. Prayer Room. Supply of pencils, Kleenex. Also make contact for possible use of carpet samples for kneeling if we decide to use rooms not already carpeted.
3. Microphones. Apart from what is on the platform, have a standup microphone available in front of the platform on audience level for every service.
4. Large screen. To be used with overhead projector or LCD (Powerpoint projector).
5. White Board/Chalkboard. Available for Kid's Crusade.
6. Handouts. Copies of printed materials should be ready for distribution at the start of the crusade.
 - A. *Heart Searching For Prayer Preparation* (use before crusade begins!)
 - B. *So Glad you Met God!* by Ralph SuturaNOTE: These items are included on this disc.



About the Finances

The offering should be taken for Christ Life Ministries utilizing the envelopes we provide. The envelopes inform people about the offering and provides receipt information. All checks should be written to the local church.

About the Financial Needs

Office and ministry expense must be met. This includes secretarial help, printing, postage, phone, social security, and numerous operating expenses. Equipment and vehicle purchases and upkeep are not provided by any church or other organization. Housing, taxes, insurance, utilities, maintenance, and all other living costs must be paid. Benefits most pastors enjoy such as hospitalization, weekly salary, vacations, etc., are met through crusade offerings.

Crusade Giving Philosophy

This is a faith ministry. Needs are not small, but no demands are made or guarantees asked. We minister to all sizes of churches throughout the year. Thus, there is *never* an offering too large considering the year-round needs. Every church needs to do its best! We serve on the God-honored, love offering basis. We do ask that the pastor and people remember that we are in revival work full time, that we have no financial sponsoring, and that we rely on revival work for our total income.

Suggested Financial Procedure

- I. Pre-Crusade Finances: Expense money should be raised before the crusade. Expenses include travel, publicity, food, accommodations, etc. The sponsoring church is asked to cover travel expense. Consider midweek offerings in advance and others if needed. Interest is created when people begin to give, and this eliminates a sizeable financial load all at one time *during* meetings.
- II. Offerings During Crusade: For ministry needs and livelihood of team members.
 - A. On Sunday mornings we ask envelopes be used for those wishing to give to Christ Life Ministries, Inc. who are unable to attend night services. Some pastors prefer to receive a love offering at the conclusion of the morning service.
 - B. Nightly services should include an opportunity for people to participate in giving a love offering to Christ Life Ministries. NOTE: If the sponsoring church elects to invite others for special music or other functions, their honorarium is to be met out of the church finances, not out of the love offering. Thank you for your cooperation in this matter.
 - C. Pastor is responsible to take nightly offerings. *Clarify nightly* how checks should be written for income tax purpose. (make checks to local church.)
 - D. Encourage people to pray and ask God what their part should be.
 - E. Share with the congregation about the needs of the ministry. The professional expenses of operating this ministry (office, secretaries, phone, printing, etc.) costs thousands of dollars yearly. In addition to ministry needs there are salary needs of the Vaughan family. Inform the congregation so that they can pray intelligently.
- III. Monthly Support: Some churches elect to support this ministry as a mission project. This relieves financial pressure and allows us to minister to smaller congregations.

SPECIAL EVENTS

PURPOSE: To plan and carry out any special events associated with the crusade.

Kids Crusade

Debbie Vaughan is available to conduct a Kids Crusade for children ages 4-9. This gives the children a ministry on their level and allows the parents to concentrate totally on the message. The Kids Crusade begins on the first night of the meeting. Children are dismissed from the main service just prior to the message.



In meetings where I fly in you might consider inviting someone who ministers to children to conduct the Kids Crusade.



Noon Prayer Time and Meal



We would like to have a prayer time each week-day at noon. The revival team, church staff, and laymen are encouraged to attend. On many occasions this is followed by lunch at the church around 12:30pm. The ladies of the church normally bring in meals for the pastoral staff and the Vaughans. This gives opportunity for sharing and saves the time involved in going out. In most churches the ladies are more than willing to serve by preparing lunch and bringing it to the church. Those providing the lunch are invited to join us. A lady in the church can be designated to organize the schedule. In planning the meal schedule we would ask that you leave one day during the week open so that we could have a family day. If we bring the travel trailer, we will take our breakfast and evening meals there. Some churches provide funds for groceries during the crusade. Please consult with me before lining up any meal engagements other than lunch.

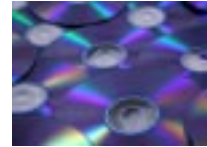
Hopefully, this will not be too burdensome or detailed as preparations are being made. Thank you for your understanding and assistance.

IMPORTANT POLICIES FOR SPIRITUAL LIFE CRUSADES

Policy of Extension

Since this is a revival ministry it is essential for churches to acquaint themselves with our scheduling procedure. We plan to be at your church during the designated time. However, if revival breaks out in a church prior to your meeting, please understand that the date for your crusade **may have to be delayed**. Our schedule belongs to the Lord and is subject to His direction. Keep your church calendar free to continue your crusade if necessary. We find that when revival comes there is often a need to extend the meeting. The final determination regarding extension of a meeting is made by the pastor.

Message Recording Policy



We request that churches check with us before recording and selling the messages from the Spiritual Life Crusade. Pre-recorded messages may be made available to anyone who desires them by CLM at the booktable.

All funds received from tape sales go toward our literature ministry. The costs of printing, editing, and postage for the newsletter are substantial. Any excess funds go toward expenses of Christ Life Publications.

OBJECTIVES OF A REVIVAL MINISTRY

The Scriptural objectives of revival are listed in points I thru V. This is the sequential order of priorities in revival.

I. Priority of Cleansing: “INWARD” Aspect of Revival

This is the time of heart-searching and brokenness before God as people deal with sin and self-centeredness to be filled with the fullness of God. (II Chron. 7:14; Ps. 41; Prov. 28:13; I Jn. 1:9)
The time of heart-searching and brokenness before God over sin is implemented by the preaching and individual response for “Personal revival.” The prayer room and invitation provide opportunities to respond.

II. Priority of restitution and Fellowship: “SIDEWARD” Aspect of Revival

True cleansing (Point I) is the NECESSARY preparation for believers to make things right with each other and have a new sense of maintaining UNITY in the church. This harmony alone can produce SPIRITUAL fellowship around the living Christ. Carnal believers are incapable of spiritual fellowship and are still prone to gossip, ego-gratification, parading materialistic excellences, and seeking man’s approval. (Heb 10:24; I Jn. 1:3-7)

The importance of being right with each other is implemented by the emphasis on restoration and restitution. Fellowship ministries are experienced through SHARING times in crusade services, prayer meetings, etc.

III. Priority of Prayer and Intercession: “UPWARD” Aspect of Revival

“If I regard iniquity in my heart, the Lord WILL NOT heart me” (Ps. 66:18). This is the problem of unanswered prayer of pastors and people seeking God for revival as well as the reason so many DO NOT attend prayer meetings in the average church. They know they are not on “praying ground” because of sin, bitterness, resentment, etc.

Do we believe we can ask God to do more in ONE MOMENT OF HIS WORKING from Heaven than we can do in years of faithful efforts? If so, why do we not give PRIORITY to continuous intercession for revival? (Is. 59:1-2)

Prayer ministry is emphasized continually during the crusade. “Revival prayer meetings” are normally held nightly after the services as well as other decided times. One of the marked results of such a revival ministry in many churches has been the renewed interest in personal prayer as well as the establishment of many weekly church prayer meetings.

IV. Priority of Discipleship: “ONWARD” Aspect of Revival

Genuine concern for others as “weak” brothers and a desire for spiritual growth can ONLY proceed from lives filled with divine love. Such a ministry will NOT succeed without the divine motivation of the Holy spirit in a believer’s life. Otherwise man is too self-centered and will drop out at the first occasion of something to his disliking. (Rom. 12:13-15; Gals. 6:1-2; Heb. 10:25; Matt. 28:19-20)

The prayer ministry and testimony times will help prepare many to be actively involved in follow-through ministries. Further discipleship ministries will be suggested according to the various circumstances in each church situation.

V. Priority of Outreach: “OUTGROWTH” Aspect of Revival

Reaching out to the lost will be the natural result of genuine revival. However, attempts at church outreach programs will FAIL when humanly motivating believers who are NOT right with God or with each other. Only daily cleansing and fresh infilling of the Holy Spirit in a believer’s life can cause him to have the “Mind of Christ” regarding the unconverted. (Mark 5:19; Lk. 19:10; I Pet. 3:15)

Outreach is the natural response of a heart right with God. Spontaneous witnessing will begin to occur as people meet God. Evangelism training by precept and practice is instituted in longer crusades. Outreach training in witnessing must be emphasized after the crusade in order to mobilize the church as a force for God.

THE REAL PROBLEM—“WE GO AT IT ALL BACKWARDS”

The average church is primarily interested in POINT V (outreach). Both pastors and people are obsessed about outreach FIRST. When attempts to motivate people fail, then POINT IV (follow through) is considered to strengthen some of the “weak” or “fringe” people in the church. If there is not spiritual motivation for outreach, what will produce a desire to minister to others in the church? When it becomes evident that there is no way to motivate carnal self-centered Christians to do this, then POINT III (intercession) is emphasized as the need. “How do we expect God to bless this church if so few come to prayer meeting?” is heard. When it remains this way because so many are NOT on “praying ground,” then POINT II (fellowship) is suggested as the real need. “We need to know each other better and have closer fellowship.” After some futile attempts, it becomes apparent that true SPIRITUAL fellowship is NOT POSSIBLE among people who do not genuinely love and walk with God.

The LAST THING most Christians are willing to admit is that they and the church need POINT I (cleansing). ISN'T IT STRANGE that we are unwilling to admit and will seek LAST what God places FIRST? We strive for FIRST what God clearly says in HIS ORDER IS LAST as a result of the rest being right. How then can we become “profitable servants” in our witness and outreach to the world?

HOW STRANGE!!!!!!!! ???? ????

Genuine revival must be the experience of the church before evangelism will become the expression of the church.

THE KEY TRUTH

GENUINE REVIVAL must be the EXPERIENCE of the church before spiritual fellowship, heart-stirring intercession, meaningful burden-bearing and ministering one to another, AS WELL AS soul-winning and evangelism become the continuing EXPRESSION of the church corporately. (II Chron. 7:12-22(v14); Ps. 51; Ps. 126; Ezek. 36:23; Jn. 13:34-35)

AN IMPORTANT WORD

I believe ANY GROUP of believers can see a genuine moving of God in their midst IF they are COMMITTED TO FOLLOWING GOD'S ORDER. Concentrate on POINT I (Cleansing) until it happens. When it does, begin to concentrate on POINT II (Restoration and Fellowship) as well as the next step, etc., etc. This DOES NOT mean that every church function or every sermon deals with the SAME subject. IT DOES MEAN that the MAIN THRUST of every area of church life should make THIS ITS AIM. It also means NOT TO ANTICIPATE other ministries of the church to produce much SPIRITUALLY on a church level UNTIL BELIEVERS ARE RIGHT WITH God and with each other. Though some souls may be saved and certain believers have personal victories, I DO NOT BELIEVE it will be CONSISTENT on a church level until GOD'S PRIORITIES become OURS. Until then we will “spin our wheels” searching out new programs in an effort to “succeed” our OWN WAY.

PUBLICITY



PURPOSE: To promote all activities associated with the crusade.

Use every honorable means of publicity.

Use newspapers, radio, television, portable billboards, posters, flyers, anything and everything at your disposal. Make your area know that you are having a crusade, and tell them over and over again in so many different ways that they will know all about it.

Portable billboards are good, different, and inexpensive. This is to be the favorite night spot in town during this week.

Visit your newspaper and lay out a growing plan of advertising. Do all you can afford. If you buy ads, they are more open to news stories about the meeting. Let your ads grow. Climax on Saturday before the first day of the crusade, and fade out on Tuesday of the crusade.

Enclosed is a picture of the evangelist and a sample news release. Be sure to submit these in plenty of time to assure entrance.

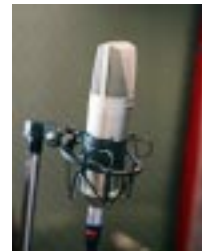
