Pushing requires effort. So does prayer. We are commanded in 1 Thessalonians to "Pray without ceasing". This requires effort. Failure to pray can be traced to a lack of effort on our part. The Holy Spirit of God speaks to us, but unless we make the effort to heed His voice, we will not hear. It's time to set aside the distractions. Pull away on your own to a place where you can pray out loud and without care, to communicate vocally and vibrantly with the God of the universe. Each prayer theme above will be divided over multiple applications of prayer.



P.U.S.H. Praying

Instructions for using this guide:

- Be sure to have a Bible, a pen, and at least an hour.
- Find a quiet place where you can speak out loud to God. Open your heart and Bible.
- Take the needed time to look up the Scriptures.
- Prayerfully answer all the questions.
- · Don't rush!

Do you have a personal relationship with God?

The first issue in prayer is knowing your sins are forgiven. Answer the questions below:

- Have I ever turned from sin and placed my faith in Christ alone for my salvation? Yes or No
- Can I sin and feel no remorse? Yes or No
- Am I convicted and chastised when I sin? Yes or No
- Do I have the inner witness of God's Spirit that assures me I am a new creature in Christ? Yes or No
- If you are uncertain of your salvation, turn to God and tell Him you are at this moment trusting Jesus' shed blood for forgiveness of your sins.

Write out a prayer of thanksgiving for God's salvation in your life:

Acknowledge your sin

Psalm 51:3 - <u>For I acknowledge my transgressions</u>: and my sin is ever before me.

We do not confess sin to God because He is unaware, we confess to align ourselves with His will and own responsibility for our wrong-doing. It begins with acknowledgement of wrong. Ask the Holy Spirit to search your heart and life. Humble yourself before the Lord now. Acknowledge your need of grace and mercy.

Confess Your Sin

Psalm 51:2 - Wash me throughly from mine iniquity, <u>and cleanse</u> me from my sin.

Take Time Now to specifically confess your sins before the Lord. Work through these questions to search your heart:

Uplifting Our King

Praising His Name

Psalm 100:4 - Enter into his gates with thanksgiving, <u>and into his</u> <u>courts with praise:</u>

Praise is about who God is, not what He does. Worship is being enthralled with the character of the Creator of the universe. Take some time to focus on His character through Scripture and mediation. Read Psalms 19 & 103. List below some specific character traits of God that are worthy of your praise:

Singing in Worship

Psalm 100:2 - Serve the Lord with gladness: <u>come before his</u> <u>presence with singing.</u>

Take some time to sing aloud your favorite worship song(s) to the Lord. Even write down your own words of worship to sing aloud!

Thanksgiving For His Blessings

Psalm 100:4 - Enter into his gates with thanksgiving, and into his courts with praise: be thankful unto him, and bless his name.

Think of specific things you are thankful for. Some categories to think through: physical provisions, spiritual blessings, relationships, wholesome pleasures, ect. List as many as you can below (seek to fill the page):

Supplication of Requests

Earnestly asking

Philippians 4:6 - Be careful for nothing; but <u>in every thing by</u> <u>prayer and supplication</u> with thanksgiving <u>let your requests be</u> made known unto God.

Supplication is just a fancy word for earnestly asking the God of the universe to respond. God wants His children to approach Him fervently and in faith, seeking His Divine response. Much of life can only be fixed through God working. Think specifically, and ask earnestly.

Listening Earnestly

Jeremiah 33:3 - Call unto me, <u>and I will answer thee, and show</u> thee great and mighty things, which thou knowest not.

God speaks. He promises to do so! Are you listening? Ask the Holy Spirit for His instructions for you at this time. "Be still" and listen for some moments.

Holding Fast to His Promises

Searching for His Promises

Isaiah 26:3 - Thou wilt keep him in perfect peace, whose mind is stayed on thee: because he <u>trusteth in thee</u>.

The promises of God are our lifeline in all the circumstances of life. We can trust in His promises at all times. Look throughout Scripture and list some specific promises below (if you don't know where to start, read through Psalm 34; there are over eighteen specific promises in this chapter).

Meditating on His goodness

Psalm 104:34 - <u>My meditation of him shall be sweet</u>: I will be glad in the LORD.

Take some time to soak yourself in the goodness of our God.

Holding Fast to His Promises

Living by faith

Hebrews 11:6 - But without faith it is impossible to please him: for he that cometh to God <u>must believe that he is, and that he is a rewarder of them that diligently seek him</u>.

Faith pleases God. Faith also takes knowledge and turns it into action! List below some actions you need to take as you return home (new habits to form, old habits to break, idols to put away, relationships to mend or end, restitutions to be made, forgiveness's to seek, people to witness to, accountability partner, family devotions, etc.)
